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What is Domestic Abuse?

Domestic abuse is defined as any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive, threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are, or have been, intimate partners or family members regardless of gender or sexuality.

Domestic Abuse can be:

- Psychological
- Physical
- Sexual
- Financial
- Emotional
- Controlling Behaviour
- Coercive Behaviour

Anyone can be abused, no matter where they live or how much money they have.

It can affect anyone, regardless of race, age, class, gender, religion or sexuality. It happens in all kinds of relationships: heterosexual, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender.

What is the Business Quality Mark?

The human and financial costs of domestic abuse are immeasurable, causing harm and disruption to families, communities and society on a massive scale.

Domestic abuse costs the UK economy £1.9 billion in lost output every year. It leads to decreased productivity, increased absenteeism and increased employee turnover.

The Domestic Abuse Business Quality Mark promotes Zero Tolerance to Domestic Abuse across businesses in Wirral.

The aim is to help staff feel supported and confident in approaching their employer for help; improve the work environment for all employees through minimising stress and absenteeism and increase employee commitment to the organisation.

The Quality Mark approach:

Large & medium size businesses

Recognise

- Unexplained absence
- Changes in performance
- Changes in appearance, behaviour

Respond

- Safety planning in work
- Review working location/ hours
- Stalking and harassment

Refer

- Local domestic abuse services
- National helplines
- Workplace mentoring

Small businesses

Recognise

- Visible marks
- Changes in appearance, behaviour
- Anxiety, fear, phone/ watch checking

Respond

- Ask open questions sensitively
- Believe
